

## YoungArts 2024 Application Requirements

# Visual Arts

**Please be sure you follow all requirements related to your application. Failure to comply with any of the requirements listed below may make your application ineligible for an award.**

## Application Requirements

The portfolio should demonstrate original thinking and a willingness to take creative risks. While it is expected that you will consult with your teachers in the selection of portfolio material, you are urged to submit work you feel best represents your personal creative interests and is work done outside of class. If it is work done in class, make sure it is work that represents your voice.

- Portfolio must include **a total of 10 images that represent eight (8) to ten (10) of your best works** from the last two years. The majority of the portfolio should explore a cohesive idea, technique, or theme. If submitting eight (8) works, the two additional images should be detail shots.
- **Written section:**
  - **Question 1:** Describe your point of view as an artist and what motivates you to create.
  - **Question 2:** Describe in detail your process and material choices.
  - **Question 3:** Explain the selections in your portfolio; why you made these decisions on your selections and their relationship to each other and to you as an artist.
- **Optional:** For those submitting video stills/documentation of performance piece: Optional 30-60 second video with audio may be uploaded.

**Note:** If you are selected as an award winner with distinction and attend National YoungArts Week, you will be part of an exhibition of works based on your portfolio submission. The curator will be making their selections for the exhibition from your portfolio.

## Media Submission Guidelines

- Do not place your name, a watermark, or any identifying information in or on your media submissions.
- You may submit an image that reveals more detail of a piece. However, you may not submit more than one detail per piece. Each detail counts towards the total of ten (10) images required.
- Do not submit images designated as "web-ready"

## Technical Specifications

Photographing Images:

- Set camera for "fine" or "extra fine" resolution, not "web" or "normal"
- Use a 6+ megapixel camera that has a high resolution setting.

# Technical Specifications (cont.)

## Photographing Images(cont.):

- Position the camera to take an image as “tight” as possible to the artwork.
- Use as much natural light as possible, minimizing the amount of artificial light needed for the image. The best photographs are taken with indirect sunlight with no glare or shadows on your artwork.
- When photographing flat works of art, use a neutral or non-distracting background and avoid covering the artwork with a surface such as glass or acetate that will produce a glare.
- Objects not related to your artwork should not be included in your picture.
- Images may not be digitally manipulated or altered other than color or contrast correction.
- Images are to be nothing more than digital representations of original artwork.

## Formatting for Images and Digital Works:

- Image File Size: Minimum of 1MB/ Maximum 20 MB.
- Image File Format: JPEG (JPG) or PNG only. TIFF images will not be accepted.
- Image File Dimensions: No smaller than 2400 pixels on the shortest side
- Image File Resolution: 300dpi

**Note:** Images will be projected on large screens during adjudications. If selected as a winner, these files will be used in print and exhibition materials.

**Equation tip:**  $\text{Pixels} / \text{shortest side} = \text{dpi}$

## Uploading Images:

- Each image must be saved and uploaded separately. (10 images in total). Files should be named either with the title or Piece 1, Piece 2, etc. if untitled.
- In the spaces provided in the application, please indicate the title of the piece (If untitled, can be named Piece 1, Piece 2, etc.), medium: give detail of materials used and technique, size, and year created for each piece.
- Do not title your files with your name or any other identifying information.
- When uploading, verify that the image is upright (not sideways or upside down).

## Uploading Video:

- Optional video may not exceed 60 seconds.
- In the spaces provided in the application, please indicate the title of the piece (If untitled, can be named Performance Video), and year created.
- Do not title your file with your name or any other identifying information.
- When uploading, verify that the video is upright (not sideways or upside down).
- In the description, please indicate if the video is documentation of work/performance or if video is your medium and provide any pertinent information that will assist the panel with their understanding of the work.

**Note:** Panel will not view video beyond 60 seconds.

# Intellectual Property and Copyright Requirements

- All submitted work must be wholly original and may not infringe upon the copyright or other intellectual property or other legal or moral rights of any other person or entity.
- If your work has been submitted to other competitions, you are responsible for getting permission to submit to YoungArts.

## Reviewers and Panel are looking for:

Work that:

- exhibits a personal vision (i.e. reflects the artists intellectual interests and emotional connection to the subject matter)
- includes a cohesive series of images illustrating a distinctive point of view, connecting the artist and the subject
- reflects intentional use of chosen artistic medium
- challenges the use of media, ideas and forms of expression
- showcases a range of approaches (formally and conceptually) to the subject matter

Keep in mind that your application is being judged as a whole. This includes all 10 images as well as your written section.
