

## HONOR GIARDINI RECEIVES 2025 YOUNGARTS LIN ARISON EXCELLENCE IN WRITING AWARD

\$50,000 Scholarship Supports Educational and Artistic Development

MIAMI (March 17, 2025) – YoungArts announces Honor Giardini as the recipient of the 2025 YoungArts Lin Arison Excellence in Writing Award, a \$50,000 scholarship given each year to a YoungArts award winner in Writing. Giardini may apply the financial award against the cost of tuition, room and board to attend an accredited school of her choice.

Made possible through the generosity of the Micky and Madeleine Arison Family Foundation, the award demonstrates how philanthropic support for YoungArts award winners can create transformative opportunities for artists throughout their careers. The Lin Arison Excellence in Writing Award is part of YoungArts' ongoing programmatic expansion, offering additional creative and professional development opportunities for artists at various career stages.

"Honor Giardini's writing is simply a marvel," said YoungArts Writing Panelist **Nicole Cooley** (1984 YoungArts Winner in Writing & U.S. Presidential Scholar in the Arts). "Risk-taking, stunning, asking urgent questions about the world we inhabit and about ourselves. From the beauty of Honor's sentences to her narratives, she is a writer to watch, and I can't wait to see her unforgettable and original work as it goes forward. What a joy to meet her at the beginning of what will be an amazing writing life."

"The college education this scholarship supports is invaluable -- and will enable me to contribute to the field of arts education. Honor Giardini is a poet and writer from rural Northern California. She is an alumnus of the lowa Young Writers Studio and California State Summer School for the Arts. Her work has been published in Roxane Gay's Emerging Writers Series, Orca: Literary Journal, Cultural Daily, and The Poetry Society's website. Honor has two dogs, five miniature donkeys and a para-social relationship with Virginia Woolf.
