

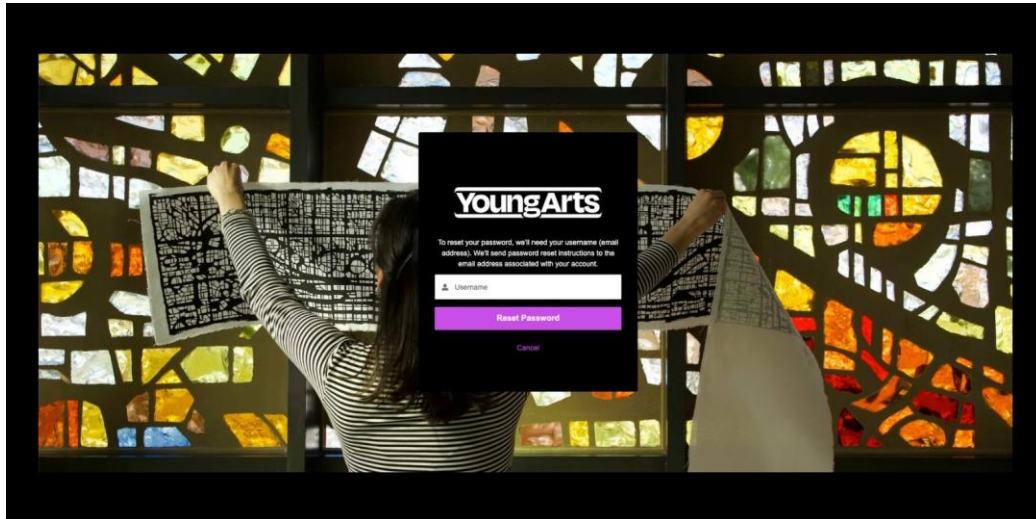
New Application Process: YoungArts National Arts Competition

All YoungArts national arts competition applications will be processed through our new application portal. For applicants who won the competition in previous years and have a profile in YoungArts Post*, you already have a profile in our new portal. Below is a quick overview of how to get started and apply:

**New applicants who have not previously won the competition and do not have a profile in YoungArts Post should not follow these instructions. Instead, [register a new account](#).*

Step 1: Reset your password

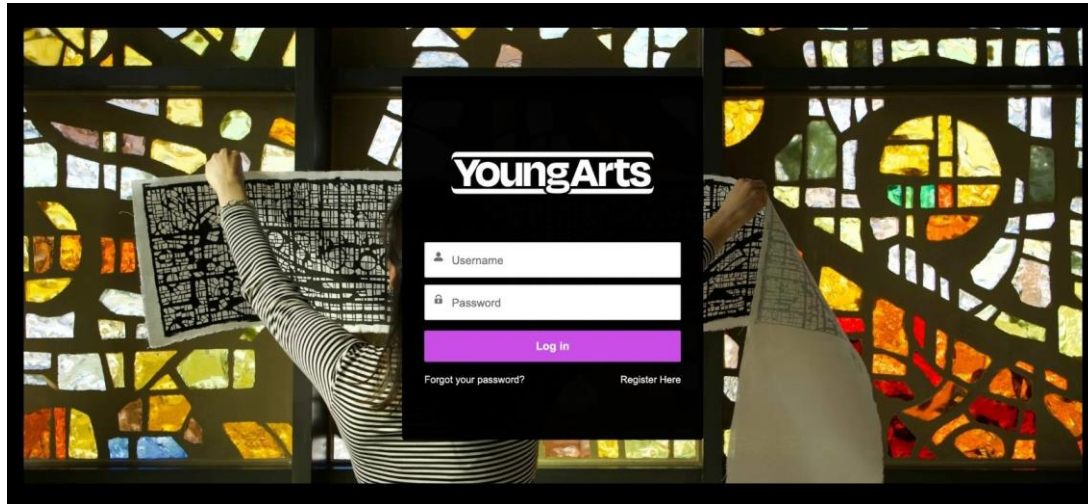
[Click here to reset your password](#). Your username will be the same email address you use to log into YoungArts Post. You will receive an email with next steps to reset your password. If you don't see an email in your inbox, be sure to check your spam folder.



If you do not receive an email to reset your password, it is likely that the email we have on file for you is outdated. If you would like to update your email address, please send an email with your current email address to community@youngarts.org.

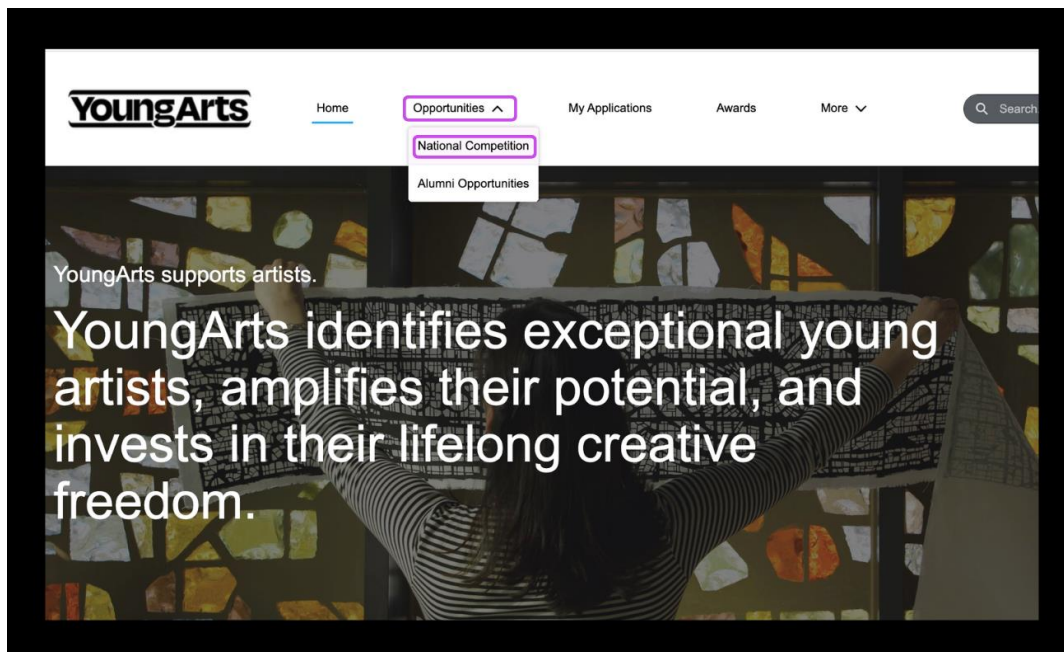
Step 2: Log in to the application portal

Once you reset your password, [click here to log in](#).



Step 3: Navigate to the 'Opportunities' tab

Once you log in, select the 'Opportunities' tab in the top navigation bar and then select 'National Competition'.



Step 4: Select a discipline to get started

Scroll down to the list of disciplines and select a discipline of your choosing. From the discipline page, select a category (if applicable) to begin your application.

Step 5: Review and Submit

Once all sections are complete, follow the instructions that appear under the '*Review and Submit*' tab of the application. Your in-progress and completed applications will be visible under the '*My Applications*' tab.
